PHONICS


We follow the Read Write Inc scheme.

We focus on:


- Sound cards

WRITING


Our writing for the first half term will link thoroughly to the book 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'.

- Joining words and clauses using 'and'
- Sequence sentences to form short narratives
