

Maths

Number : Fractions

Initially covering the key concepts of Year 2, moving onto Year 3 curriculum work.

* Measurement : Time


- Geometry : Shape
- * Measurement: Mass and Capacity followed by Length and Perimeter

- Lots of 3,4 and 8 times table practice in class.
- Times Tables Rockstars.

Reading and Spelling

- Guided reading 3 sessions per week where children work in groups with adult support.
- Focussing on reading fluency, inference, prediction, retrieval and summarising of the text.
- Children will occasionally take their guided reading books home and will have set pages to read at home with family.
- Reading for pleasure will continue and adults are asked to comment in the reading diary at least once a week after listening to your child read.

- Weekly spelling sent home each Thursday and tested the following Thursday. All children are requested to write a sentence for each spelling word as their homework. Please support your children by encouraging them to practice their spellings regularly.
- The focus this term will be on homophones, prefixes and suffixes.
- The children are always encouraged to look for a spelling pattern each week.



Geography

Earthquakes

We will be looking at the cause and effects of earthquakes around the world and in particular around the 'ring of fire'.

We will be finding out about the tectonic plates, tsunamis and volcanoes and exploring how they are all linked.

Science will also feature heavily into this topic of work as we experiment with rocks and carry out volcano experiments.

Science – Rocks and Volcanoes

- Compare rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties.
- Observe, explore and describe how fossils are formed.
 - Recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.
 - Volcano experiment.

Crime and Punishment – Social History

- Following on from last term's work on the Anglo Saxons, we will be investigating changes in an aspect of social history from the Anglo Saxons to the present.
- We will complete a study of an aspect of history or a site dating from a period beyond 1066 that is significant in the locality.
- The study will extend the children's chronological knowledge beyond 1066.

How you can support your child

- Listen regularly to your child reading. Ask questions about what they are reading as this will encourage your child to think deeply about their reading. Children learn new language and ideas from speaking and listening. Regularly reading to your child is a great way to support their writing.
- Diversity is key! Encouraging your child to read as many different styles of writing as they can as it will expand their vocabulary and knowledge.
- Maths can be supported by practicing the relevant times tables (Year 3 focus on the 3,4 & 8, Year 2 focus on 2, 5 & 10).
- You might also like to help them learn to tell the time or give them the opportunity to use money in real life contexts. When out shopping ask questions such as 'how much change will I need?' These simple examples will help your child's reasoning skills both in and out of class.

- Spellings tested and new spellings given out on a Thursday.
- PE Thursdays and Fridays (wear joggers and school hoody/sweatshirt and trainers to school).
